Statement from the Chairman: On behalf of the Parish Council, I would like to thank all those residents who submitted comments on AVDC's proposal to build some 9,600 houses with other associated developments in the “Eastern Arc”. Particular thanks are due to the Action Group, vigorously led by Tony Strevens, but strongly supported by his wife Liz, John Sylvester and John Chantler (and to Hany Girgis from Watermead for his IT expertise). The Action Group submitted a folder with over 30 statements of objection, while the Parish Council's dossier contained some 24 statements. These will be submitted to the Independent Government Inspector who will hold an Examination in Public Early next year. Both the Action Group and the Parish Council have asked to attend the Examination so that our objections can be comprehensively explained in person. We must now wait to see how the Inspector reacts to our submissions; in the meantime, we will continue to use every opportunity to express our concerns.
