- **Love food hate waste!** UK households are throwing away 8.3m tonnes of food a year, most of which is perfectly edible. **A typical family with kids bins £680 worth.** Equally unsettling is the environmental cost - the wasted water and energy in growing and transporting uneaten food and the methane it produces in landfill. So, how can we do better?
  - 1) Send less food to landfill. (See [lovefoodhatewaste.com](http://lovefoodhatewaste.com)).
  - 2) Compost food waste. **Over 30%** of average household waste could be composted.
  - 3) Recycle food containers. On average the UK resident sends **2000kg of waste** to landfill every year.

- **The new Aston Clinton Household Waste Recycling Centre is now open.** It is located off the A41 bypass at the clearly marked exit for College Road North. It has facilities for depositing 24 different categories of unwanted items, e.g. glass, paper, batteries, textiles and more. Open 8am – 6pm in summer months and 8am – 5pm winter - 7 days per week. (Editor's note – far more user-friendly than the Raban's Lane site!)
