## How to get involved?

Our aim is for everyone to know about the community allotment and for those that want to be involved in whatever form can do so.

**How does the Community Allotment work?** It's evolving. It's what YOU want it to be. We ask that you come and meet with us so we can walk you through the site, where everything is, so we don't upset other allotment holders and then you are given the code and free access.

Why not **visit the allotment after school** with the kids and have a picnic? **Working from home?** – wander up and enjoy the space and peace and have your lunch.

**New to the village?** – come to the arranged events and make friends and arrange times to come up with others.

We want the allotment to be for **EVERYONE** in the community so if you can't give time but would like to enjoy the fresh produce – THAT'S OK. Come and help yourself or take from the basket at the end of Beech Close. We don't want any waste. If you enjoy growing at home and have surplus, put in the basket at the end of Beech Close for all to share. There are so many ways to get involved – one of our most active members hates vegetables but loves the community project and helps with all the physical preparation and building. They'll be others who can't physically get to the allotment but could help prepare labels, bag up seeds for our growers, plant seeds for germination all off site in the early season with the added bonus of coffee and cake. This is OUR allotment and if you want to be involved we will find a job for you. If you just want to come up and chat as we are pottering around then that would be great too.

There will be a list of jobs in the greenhouse if you want to go up when you have a free hour and crack on. Please don't worry about doing the wrong thing, we are all learning. Sometimes it is lovely to enjoy the space alone and at other times it's nice to meet up with others. # A418 FREIGHT CONSULTATION - HAVE YOUR SAY

Buckinghamshire Council is consulting about the boundaries of the freight zone east of the A418, north of the A41 and west of the B440. To reduce HGV flows through Bierton and the Aylesbury town centre the preferred route for this traffic is to take the following journey. Along the Eastern Link Road off the A418 on to the Stocklake Link Road to the A4157 and on to the A41 towards Hemel Hempstead and the M25. This works in reverse for traffic from the A41 wishing to take the A418 towards Leighton Buzzard, Dunstable, the M1, and beyond.

## HISTORY OF BIERTON'S PUBS

Records show that at one point there were 7 pubs in Bierton and 2 in Broughton. In recent memory both the **Red Lion and Bell** were operational and the Doghouse is still open.



**The Bell** pub was operational until 2019 and was most recently a Thai restaurant and bar.

It's currently being converted into an Indian restaurant which is due to open in late 2021/early 2022. **The Red Lion** is a Grade II listed 16th century pub, with some claims to have housed troops during the English Civil War.

*Opposite the Red Lion and on the corner of Parsons Lane was **the Crown** (photo left below). From censuses we know the landlords and residents through most of the 1800's but don't know when it was closed and demolished.*

*Next to Jubilee Hall was **the Eagle**, which some residents remember visiting to buy beer in the early 1970's - if you look closely you can see the name of the pub etched on the glass of the door. **The New Inn** was located almost opposite Barnett Way and **the Star** (near 163 Aylesbury Road) and **Plough** (near Plough End) were located nearby.*

*In Broughton, **The Doghouse** was formerly known as the Prince of Wales, changing it's name to the Old Moat House c1997, further in Broughton and past the canal bridge was **The Seven Stars**, now the Old Seven Stars Cottage*
